## Hal Dengerink picked to help move WSU branch campuses into statewide system

Hal Dengerink, campus executive officer and dean at Washington State University Vancouver, has been selected by Washington State University president V. Lane Rawlins to help develop a university system that will give branch campuses, including Vancouver's, more autonomy.

Dengerink will serve as special assistant to the president over the next two years but also will maintain his leadership duties at WSU Vancouver.

Rawlins said that Dengerink is one of the architects of the recommendations to move toward a WSU system from the branch campus concept.

"It's time to recognize that the three branch campuses are unique campuses and not simply branches of the Pullman campus," Rawlins said.

"Hal Dengerink is a natural choice to work with me and provost **Bob Bates** on this over the next two years, given his long service as a faculty member and administrator on the Pullman campus and his influential leadership of the WSU Vancouver campus."

Of WSU's 22,000 students, 3,750 are enrolled at branch campuses in Vancouver, Tri Cities and Spokane.

Dengerink joined Washington State University as a member of the psychology faculty in 1969. Since 1989 he has served as CEO and dean of WSU Vancouver.

# Battle Ground School District levy passing as elections department counts final votes

With literally less than a handful of votes from the Feb. 5 special election to be counted before official certification Friday, Feb. 14, the Battle Ground School District special levy request for \$24 million over the next three years is

With Battle Ground safely past the 60 percent majority threshold, all eight county school districts requesting special levy support were successful.

In total, voters from the districts approved over \$231

million in special levy support.

Battle Ground's was the squeakiest victory. The vote count today is 7,754 yes, 5,100 no, just 31 votes above the required 60 percent.
