## Clark Public Utilities looking at 5 percent rate increase in April

Facing an April increase of nearly 8 percent from power wholesaler Bonneville Power Administration, Clark Clark Public Utilities commissioners today heard staff recommendations pointing toward a retail increase for its customers of 5 percent, effective in April.

Commissioners were also warned that BPA is likely to call for another wholesale rate increase in October.

An option for covering further BPA increases this year would be an additional 2 percent hike in April. Otherwise the utility could face having to raise rates again in October by another 5 percent.

Commissioners will decide the April rate increase at their 9 a.m. meeting Tuesday, March 18.

Representatives of several members of Clark County's industrial customer group were in the audience this morning. For some local industrial customers electric energy is the major cost in their manufacturing process.

They were not at today's meeting to complain about power rates; rather to hear a presentation by the utility's director of energy resources **Jim Sanders** on a proposal that would allow large energy users the option of buying electricity outside the utility and outside BPA.

That practice was allowed from 1998 to 2001 but the four customers who opted for outside power eventually returned to Clark as their choice.

Sanders reported that further study would be required to see how such an arrangement could be made that would not have any negative impact on the utility's other customers.
