## Bank of Clark County reports banner year

Net income for the Bank of Clark County increased 150 percent over 2001 levels, resulting in a new profit of \$1,050,042, bank president Mike Worthy reported today.

The bank's assets increased 39 percent to over \$130 million, fueled by a 44 percent increase in the loan portfolio. Bank deposits grew by 42 percent in 2002, according to Worthy.
