Absentee response to Tuesday's school levy elections is heavy

One of two absentee ballot recipients this morning had returned his or her vote on Tuesday's school district levy elections to the Clark County Elections office, according to elections supervisor Tim Likness.

Nearly 30 percent of the 163,586 registered voters in the eight school districts in which levy requests are made have already voted.

The elections department sent 95,996 absentee ballots, of which just over 50 percent, 48,083, have been returned.

Eight school districts are asking collectively for \$231 million in from three-year levies that replace existing levies.

For the most part, the requested levies are not for an increase in taxes and, in some cases, the levy requests represent a slight decrease from the expiring special levies.

The Vancouver School District's request for \$86.1 million over three years is only slightly larger than the Evergreen School District's \$83.1 million request.

Districts in which special levies are requested are Vancouver, Evergreen, Battle Ground Camas, Washougal, La Center, Woodland and Green Mountain.

Polling places will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. Tuesday, Feb. 4, the official election day for eight school districts.
