Commissioners to consider spending for 2007-2008

Budget proposals for 2007 and 2008 will be the focus of a public hearing before Clark County commissioners at 2 p.m. Monday, Dec. 4. Budget sessions will be in the sixth floor hearing room in the Public Service Center, 1300 Franklin Street.

The hearing will open with presentations by county administrator Bill Barron and budget director Glenn **Olson**, followed by an examination of budgets presented by county departments headed by elected officials. The first day of budget hearings will end at 5 p.m. The hearing will resume at 10 a.m. Tuesday, Dec. 5.

The primary opportunity for public comment will be during a session that opens at 6:30 p.m. Tuesday Dec. 5. However, chairman of the board of commissioners Marc Boldt said that requests to speak on Monday or Tuesday for those who are unable to attend the evening session will be considered.
