

Families with children accounted for nearly half the homeless in Clark County

On January 26, nearly half of the 1,391 persons counted as homeless by the Emergency Shelter Clearing-house for the Clark County Council for the Homeless were families with children, reports **Kim Connor**, executive director of the Council for the Homeless.

Families with children accounted for 665 of the homeless. The count also included 688 individuals, of whom nearly one-third were women. Thirty-eight teenage or younger persons were found to be homeless.

All but 271 of the homeless people counted were living on the street, Connor said. The others were being housed in emergency shelters.

A homeless count is conducted annually by the clearinghouse.
