Dunn takes lead over Campbell

Incumbent Republican 17th District legislator **Jim Dunn**, who Thursday said he wasn't yet ecstatic when the vote county brought him within 144 votes of Democratic rival Pat Campbell, is likely at least smiling today since the continuing count of Clark County ballots put the veteran legislator ahead by 308 votes Friday.

Most of the ballots in an election that brought out over 63 percent of the local electorate have been counted, and, although tabulations will continue next week, it appears Dunn's lead is definitive.

Southwest Washington Medical Center employs 3,280 persons and has 545 active medical staff members.


