Concrete canoe work at Capt. William Clark Park makes impression on state association judges

Concrete replicas of Lewis and Clarkera native canoes at Capt. William Clark Park in Washougal have earned the state Aggregates and Concrete Association's Special Applications Artistic Merit Award.

The concrete canoes replicate Chinookian ponderosa pine dugout canoes and Chinookian western red cedar canoes in such detail that visitors to the park have commented that the "wooden" canoes would be likely to rot on the ground," according to **Ron Mah**, landscape architect from the JD White division of BERGER/ABAM Engineers, which led the master planning and development of the park.
