

Growth management plan hearings begin Tuesday

Two public hearings being held jointly by the Board of Clark County Commissioners and the county Planning Commission on the proposed update of the county Comprehensive Growth Management Plan are at 6:30 p.m. Tuesday, Nov. 28, and Wednesday, Nov. 29, in the commissioners' hearing room in the Public Service Center, 1300 Franklin Street.

County commissioners are asking for comments from individuals, property owners and neighborhood groups Tuesday evening and for comments from representatives of cities, school districts, and public agencies and organizations other than neighborhood associations, on Wednesday evening.
