State's average annual wage increases to \$40,385

The annual average wage in Washington has increased by 3.5 percent, to \$40,385, for 2005, according to the state Employment Security Department.

With the increase comes an increase in the minimum weekly unemployment benefit, which is calculated at 15 percent of the average weekly wage. The minimum rate will go up to \$116, from \$112, starting July 1. The maximum weekly benefit has been capped by the legislature at \$496 a week.

The average wage is also used to compute employer taxes. Beginning Jan. 1, 2007, employers will pay unemployment taxes on the first 31,400 paid to each employee.
