County growth apparently slowing

Clark Public Utilities signed up only 185 new residential customers during April this year. During the first three months of this year, by contrast, an average of over 300 customers a month. signed up for residential electricity

In all of 2005 the utility acquired 4,371 residential customers—an annual rate of growth of 2.73 percent. This year's annual growth rate is 2.04 percent.

April, traditionally, is a slow residential growth month. Even so, 1,097 new customers for the first four months of 2006 is well below the average.
