Low interest loans available

for septic tank improvements

Residents of the Salmon Creek and Gibbons Creek watersheds whose septic tank systems are failing may be eligible for low-interest loans for repair or replacement, reports **Jonnie Hyde**, public health services manager for Clark County Environmental Health Services.

Loans may run as long as five years and will have an interest rate of 1.5 percent, according to Hyde.
