Get Jazzed! Wine & Jazz Festival to offer a musical feast

When the 10th renewal of **Michael Kissinger's** Wine & Jazz Festival opens Friday, Aug. 24, in Esther Short Park, the three-day wine, fine arts and international jazz listings, which has become one of the most important jazz venues in the Pacific Northwest, will offer jazz—and plenty of it—for just about every jazz taste bud.

Impresario Kissinger has come a long way from the first festival in September 1998 on the graveled-over site of the derelict downtown Lucky Lager Brewery to the shaded greenswards Esther Short Park, in recent years.
