A quality restaurant, according to the wastewater district, would be a full-service eatery with turnover rates of one hour or more. They generally require reservations and aren't open for breakfast. While some do offer lunch, all serve dinner and seat at least 150 people.

The district is offering a 31 percent reduction in sewer connection charges and lower cost services than to other restaurants.
