Vancouver Symphony Orchestra hosts sixteenth annual young artists competition

The Vancouver Symphony Orchestra will host its sixteenth annual Young Artists Competition, where students will compete to win \$1,000 and a chance to perform with the VSO on April 17 and 18, 2010, at Skyview High School Concert Hall.

The competition is open to all students 18 years or younger. Contestants must currently be studying with a music teacher and must reside within a fifty-mile radius of Vancouver, WA. Previous first-place winners of this competition are not eligible.

The musical selection will consist of standard concerto repertoire and must be less than fifteen minutes in length.

Professional musicians in each category will select the finalists. Up to nine finalists will perform "concert style" before a panel of judges. The final competition of the top three finalists in each category will be held March 7, 2010, at the Royal Durst Theatre at the Vancouver School of Arts and Academics. Winning amounts are \$1,000 for first place, \$500 for second place and \$250 for third place in the three categories of strings, piano and brass/woodwinds/percussion.

Deadline for submission of the entry form, \$25 entry fee and audition CD is Monday, Jan. 4, 2010. All entries should be sent to VSO Orchestra Manager **Douglas Peebles**.
